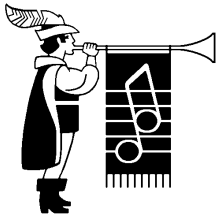

Message from the President

In these unprecedented times, flexibility is becoming a major asset. Rather than giving up everything, we have to find new ways to enjoy life. Non-profits face the same challenge.

Your Guild Board is working hard to keep some semblance of continuity to the programs we enjoy. For example, in spite of not being able to host ASO for our annual Christmas in the Village program, we have found a way to continue one aspect of the Christmas tradition – our food drive to support our local schools. Read details in this newsletter. We believe we have found a way to present one of my favorite programs, the Henderson State University President's Concert Competition Winners. We will have to limit the audience, and perhaps modify some of the performances, but we plan to proceed with the concert in January.

Arkansas Symphony Orchestra is also demonstrating flexibility. Having cancelled the 20-21 program, they were able to reschedule the conductors and soloists for 21-22. During winter/spring of 2021, they plan to present a series of limited concerts that will allow both orchestra and audience to social distance, in concerts with no intermission.

In the meantime, they are keeping their mission alive and their community presence. The highly acclaimed “Bedtime with Bach” series has become a weekly program, on Facebook Sunday night (and subsequently available on YouTube). They are presenting a series of outdoor concerts of various formats in different venues. These will include some collaborations with Arkansas ballet. The River Rhapsody chamber series is being live streamed from smaller local venues..

Both the Guild and the ASO are striving to keep our educational programs active, to the extent the schools can be flexible as well. Some of the school programs are being presented on-line, either live or taped.

So regardless of the situation, the ASO and your HS/HSV Symphony Guild are doing everything we can to keep our selves relevant and vital, to stay true to our most important mission -- *to present and*

foster an appreciation for fine music in our community.

It therefore remains vital that you continue your support of the Symphony Guild, the ASO, and any other arts program you appreciate. One opportunity to do that is Giving Tuesday. Please see more on that elsewhere in this newsletter. These are trying times, but with strong supporters, we will get through this.

Recently, Clara Nicolosi presented Education VP Donna Toney with her “gently used” coronet. Before taking up the French horn during her high school years, Clara played the coronet. She had hopes of finding the time to resume that interest. However, ten years has flown by, and that hope has pretty well vanished, given her

busy schedule as HSV volunteer and broker/owner of ReMax of Hot Springs Village.

This exceptional Getzen coronet is barely used and came in a beautiful case with all the instrument's accessories, including a music book. It will make it possible for another child to participate in the school band, just as Clara did during her high school years.

VP Toney plans to deliver the coronet to Mountain Pine in the very near future. Mountain Pine band director Chris Johns has already reached out to thank Donna and the Guild for the musical programs the Education group sponsors in the school (and also in other schools in Garland County) as well as these much appreciated gifts of musical instruments and accessories.
